### EARLY ENTRY DEADLINE: Friday, July 23, 2010

*Entry Fee:* \$3.00 per class (including groups) – for those animals staying on the grounds  
\$6.00 per class (including groups) – for those animals arriving day of show

*Late Entry Fee for Entries (Postmarked 7/24/2010 or after):* \$15.00 per class (including groups)  
(the late fee is instead of the \$3 or \$6 early entry fee, not in addition to)

### A.D.G.A. Goat Schedule

*Arrival:* All goats staying on the grounds (and paying the \$3 entry fee, rather than the \$6 entry fee) must be on the grounds by 12 noon on Wednesday, August 11<sup>th</sup>.  
*Show:* Monday, August 16th at 9:00 AM (the Junior and Senior Shows are not separately sanctioned)  
*Judge:* Mr. Robert Bartholomew, NY  
*Release:* After the completion of the Goat Show on Monday, August 16<sup>th</sup>, and must be off the grounds by 10 PM.

### A.D.G.A. GOAT RULES

1. Exhibitors have the option to pay the \$3.00 entry fee per class (including groups) if they choose to have their animals on exhibit on the Fairgrounds from Monday through Sunday. Those exhibitors who opt not to bring their animals to stay on the Fairgrounds will pay the \$6 entry fee, per class (including groups).
2. **NEW~** Individual animals shall be charged an entry fee when entered in a group class. NO substitutions. (Only 1 fee to be paid per group class though.)
3. ADGA rules shall govern. This show is sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association.
4. Does with horns may not enter. All animals must have a legible tattoo. There will be NO pre-show milk-out, over distended udders are subject to discrimination. Judges' decision is final. All dairy goats are entered at the sole risk of the owners. Base date for computing the age of dairy goats is the date of the show.
5. Registration or Recordation certificates:
  1. A registration or recordation certificate for any animal six months of age or older is required.
  2. The registration or recordation certificate or the stamped duplicate application showing the date received by the ADGA office is required for any animal under six months of age.
  3. NO COPIES of the registration or recordation certificate or stamped duplicate application shall be accepted by the show officials.
  4. The document specified above as the requirement for that age animal to be shown MUST be presented to the show secretary before the judging shall begin.
  5. Proof of ownership shall be the name on the registration or recordation certificate or on the stamped duplicate application.
  6. Information obtained from the ADGA office via telephone, telegram, etc shall not be accepted in lieu of any of the documents specified above.
6. ALL Grand Champion Does and Reserve Grand Champion Does must remain on the grounds until the completion of the judging for BEST DOE IN SHOW.
7. Rules of the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets Standards for the Conduct of Agriculture and Markets Standards for the Conduct of Fairs and Summary of Livestock Health Requirements shall apply.
8. Absolutely no milk is to be dumped in the Fairgrounds storm sewer system.
9. All exhibitors are required to make sure that their showmen are properly attired in either all white or white shirts with black pants (no jeans) while showing in the ring. Clothing must be clean and professional/presentable. Adequate footwear required (i.e. no flip-flops or sandals).
10. All animals must remain on exhibit until the completion of the show, when they may be released.
11. Initial bedding will be supplied to exhibitors. However, if the exhibitor wishes to have shavings or straw they must bring it or buy it from a purveyor on the grounds. The Fair will not be providing straw or shavings.
12. Entry fees do not guarantee "tack pens". In divisions where entries do not exceed available space "tack pens" will be assigned by the superintendent.
13. Premium checks will be available in the Competitive Exhibits office on Friday, August 20<sup>th</sup> through Sunday, August 22<sup>nd</sup>, 9:00 AM – 5:00 PM. Any premium checks not picked up will be mailed.

**\$22.50 \$18.75 \$16.25 \$13.75 \$10.00**

17. Champion Challenge entry fee of \$3 for goats staying or \$6 for the goats coming in for the day - The Champion Challenge class to consist of PERMANENT CHAMPIONS (proof will be the prefix CH or GCH as affixed by ADGA on the animal's registration certificate) and the breed Grand Champion of the regular class. Winner to be known as BEST OF BREED and to compete for BEST DOE IN SHOW.

**GROUP CLASSES – Limited to 2 entries per herd in each class**

18. Get-of-Sire - to consist of three (3) does-the get of one sire. Sire must be named. Borrowing is allowed.
19. Dam and daughter - to consist of a Dam and her daughter. Borrowing is allowed. Dam must be named.
20. Dairy herd - to consist of four does-of which two (2) are in milk. All owned by exhibitor or exhibitors' immediate family.
21. Best udder – *must be pre-entered.*
22. Bred by Exhibitor – animal must carry your herd name, to be done by breed.
23. Junior Exhibitor's Best Doe – for junior aged exhibitors (age 19 years & younger). 1 entry per breed. Must be owned/leased **AND SHOWN** by the junior exhibitor.

**SECTION K – SHOWMANSHIP (No entry fee charged)**

**PREMIUMS \$10.00 \$7.50 \$6.25 \$5.00 \$3.75**

**BEST UDDER IN SHOW**  
**BEST DOE IN SHOW**

**Herdsmanship Award:** Three Herdsmanship awards will be given out to goat exhibitors. 1<sup>st</sup> place: \$50 and a banner, 2<sup>nd</sup> place: \$30.00, 3<sup>rd</sup> place: \$15.00. Fair & Show Management will judge the exhibitors daily on the following criteria:

1. Cleanliness & neatness of aisles, pens, bedding and animals, and exhibitor's living quarters.
2. Courtesy to fellow breeders, spectators and others during the exhibit.
3. Personal appearance, including neatness and cleanliness of clothing in and out of the show ring.
4. Systematic and neat arrangement of feed, feed pans, bedding, tack, etc.
5. Educational materials on display
6. Stall decorations that tie with the Fair theme, "Fair Fever – Catch It!" will receive bonus points.
