HORSE RULES

- a) The New York State 4-H Horse Show Rules are applicable. Copies can be reviewed on the 4-H website (<http://www.ansci.cornell.edu/4-H/horses/index.html>). The judge's decision will be final. Any protests should be directed to the Show Steward.
- b) Horses and ponies must be owned or leased by the 4-H member by May 1st of the current year. No equine may be exhibited by more than two (2) exhibitors and in such case these two (2) exhibitors will not be allowed to show in the same age group of any division. No equine may be entered by more than one (1) exhibitor in any class.
- c) Horse participants must be 8 years old as of January 1, 2010; **however, 8 year old exhibitors are limited to walk trot classes only.**
- d) The following steps must be taken on or before July 12, 2010 to properly enter an eligible horse for this show. Late entries will not be accepted.
 - (1) Complete entry form
 - (2) Statement of ownership or lease completion by May 1, of current year signed by a parent or guardian. (Statement found on entry form).
 - (3) Submit the following to the 4-H Office by May 1, of current year: Horse Certificate, and copies of each horse's Coggins test, rabies vaccine certificate, and Acknowledgement of Risk form.
 - (4) Proof of required clinic attendance; each exhibitor must submit original copy of signed attendance card.
 - (5) Riding Level Evaluation for members who did not ride in any 2009 show or for any member changing riding levels.
- e) Substitution of horses due to injuries after entries have been closed can only be made under the following conditions:
 - (1) Veterinarian certification of injury with explanation of injury (severity) and date of injury.
 - (2) Substitute horse must have the appropriate paperwork on file with the 4-H office by May 1, of current year. See Rule (c).
 - (3) Horse may only be eligible to enter in the formerly declared classes of the horse they are replacing. No change in classes will be permitted.
- f) All horses must pass an inspection before being allowed to enter the show. The inspection will insure that each horse is in good physical condition, sound, free from blemishes that would detract from the show. Approved riding helmets must be worn at all times & are subject to inspection at any time. Regarding Coggins & Rabies please see Erie County Fair Rules and Regulations.
- g) **Stall space will be available 6:00 PM until 8:00 PM on Sunday, August 15, 2010.** The 4-H Horse show officially ends on Tuesday, August 17, 2010. All Horses not assigned open class stalls must leave the grounds by **Tuesday, August 17, 2010 by 11:00 P.M.** Failure to remove horses & clean stalls at this time will result in future loss of showing privilege. 4-H can assume no responsibility for members or horses, their housing, supervision or care after this date.
- h) Horses will be assigned available stalls for Sunday and Monday nights. Initial straw bedding will be provided. Shavings available for purchase. All horse exhibitors must supply their own hay.
- i) If 4-H dormitory accommodations are needed please call the 4-H office. Reservations must be made by July 12, 2010. **No 4-H exhibitor may spend the night in tack stalls and only in campers under parental supervision.**
- j) Each equine may enter no more than five (5) classes in any division and no more than fifteen (15) in the show. Fitting and Showmanship and Costume classes do not count in determining the number of classes in a division or in the show.
- k) Mules will be allowed to show in equine classes.
- l) All horse vans and trailers are to be parked in the designated parking lot, outside the grounds.
- m) Exhibitor and parking passes may be picked up at the 4-H Youth Development Building on August 7th, thereafter at the 4-H Livestock Office. Exhibitor and parking passes will not be mailed.
- n) **Novice classes will be separated for fitting & showing only into appropriate English and Western divisions. Performance classes will be combined English and Western; and will be run in conjunction with the English classes' ring schedule.**

NOTE: You will not be allowed to add classes or make changes the day of the show. Please review your entry form carefully!
